Annual quilt show opens April 4

SPOKANE, Wash. — Waterford on South Hill will display more than 100 quilts at their 9th Annual Quilt Show, “A Walk through a Garden of Quilts.” The show runs Friday, April 4, and Saturday, April 5, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at 29th and Pittsburg Ave. There is no admission fee, and the event is open to the public.

Many quilts will be accompanied by written histories telling the quilts’ stories. Mary Johnson, Waterford’s director of sales, contributed a quilt and story. For her 1980 wedding, Johnson’s mother-in-law commissioned a “wedding-party quilt,” made of fabric from bridesmaids’ dresses and dresses worn by the mothers of the bride and groom. The blue and yellow crib quilt was created in a Holly Hobby style.

During the show — which features quilting vendors and prizes — members of the Waterford Quilt Club will demonstrate quilting techniques and work on the Touchmark Foundation quilt. The project will raise funds for the foundation’s efforts to improve the lives of seniors.

In addition, keynote speaker Jackie Wolff, who owns Spokane’s Quilting Bee, will address the history of Spokane quilting at 2 p.m. on Friday and 10 a.m. on Saturday.
